The resident owner of the Toll House was also in attendance to support the proposal. Cllr Reade agreed to follow up the proposal with Chris Harris at SGC and the local MP and feedback directly to the Directors of the Home Barns Management Company and Parish Council.

Parish Council support was proposed by Cllr Flint, seconded by Cllr Finnegan, carried unanimously.

- Clearing of Ringswell Common – notice was given to the Parish Council that clearing of the scrubland to the north side of the road at Ringswell Common was going ahead, to be completed later in the year. The aim is to preserve the Common and its ecosystem. All mature trees would be left in place and the area reseeded with wild meadow seed mix.
